
to face or discuss things on the telephone. A quick note to the teacher, or an email is a good start.

Reminders

Please ensure that your children are prepared for these hot, muggy days. Named sunhats & appropriate clothing is a must. Shoulders need to be protected, so avoid those shoe string straps please girls.

Healthy lunches are vital for growing children. We promote healthy eating & drinking water at Tomarata School. Children also need a separate snack for brain break every day. We ask that you try not to use plastic wrappers as we are an environmentally friendly school promoting litter free lunches.

If your child is going to be absent please let us know. You can do this through HERO or by leaving a message on the phone or website. This is important for safety reasons as well as for Ministry compliance. We need to know where our children are, & that they are safely under supervision. Getting to school on time every day is an important routine to re-establish especially after Lockdown. Reports on attendance go to the Ministry every week, as well as termly to the BOT.
