Our Vision

Keeping class sizes manageable and adding extra support where it is needed helps everyone work on their goals in the best possible environment.

All of our classes at Tomarata School are small which gives the teachers an opportunity to work more closely with the children. As you know getting support for children is not an easy process, & I am spending a considerable amount of time haranguing the Ministry of Education for funds & money for our children. It is a very difficult task! However this year I have managed to get the following:

- Funding for a child counsellor
- Funding for some teacher aide assistance
- Assistive technology equipment for 2 students
- Funding for equipment for the Makerspace to engage students after Covid lockdowns
- RTLB funding for special programmes
- RTLB intervention
- Interim response funding
- High Health Needs funding
- Educational Psychologist referrals
- SWIS (Social Worker in Schools) who will be starting with us next term

None of these fundings are permanent, & it is an ongoing battle, but it is vitally important so I keep on fighting the system for the sake of our children.

Room 1 have been learning about planting & repotting seedlings












Room 7 tends to the Butterfly garden.
