Firstly, I'd like to thank everyone that helped to make our end of Term 2, Open Day such a success. It was really heartwarming to have people come in from the school community, as well as past pupils, and families thinking of sending their children to Tomarata School. We had a lot of very positive feedback on the day and it was the perfect way to end the term.

This Term, our whole school focus topic is Our School, Our Community. We will be inquiring into the uniqueness of Tomarata as an area.
