It's been a really busy week at Tomarata School. We have had a bit of everything...

The power outage on Friday was caused by some overhead lines being accidentally pulled down on a nearby farm. Because of our reliance on electricity to run our water system, we had to close the school. Moving forward, the school is looking to purchase a simple generator, so that we can keep the water flowing in the event of a power cut.

Monday's rain and high tide combined to force us to make the call to close early. Thankfully, with the support of our awesome parent/grandparent community, we were able to make sure that all children made it home safely.

I'm really thankful to Heather Thomas and Robyn Sibtsen for helping out on the phones, and for Victoria King who dropped a few students home.

One thing that did come up during these events was that some students' emergency contact details need to be updated. If you have any updated contact information, could you please let the school office know.

Also, if you are using the Hero app, can you please make sure that the notifications are switched on. As a school, our first method of making contact in events like this will be Hero.

On Tuesday, we were visited by the team at Ballance Agri-Nutrients, Whangarei. They have an initiative where they donate fruit trees to rural schools, and come along to help with the planting. They worked with the team to plant two pear trees, two plum trees, a nectarine, and an apple tree. They also gifted the school enough fertiliser to last us for a couple of years, a book on growing great crops, and certificates for all of the students involved on the day. Also there on Tuesday was Leah from the *Country Life* programme on Radio New Zealand National. She was visiting us to put together a story about our amazing school, and our commitment to outdoor education. Leah interviewed a number of students, and was there to see

the kids in action planting the fruit trees. It was really gratifying to be able to tell her all about our awesome tamariki, and the work that we do here at Tomarata School. I'm not sure when the programme will air, but *Country Life* is on Friday nights, and again on Saturday mornings.
