Principal's Message

Kia ora koutou,

It's been an awesome couple of weeks here at Tomarata School. I've been able to visit all classrooms and am really pleased with all of the learning opportunities that our tamariki are getting. Thanks so much to our team of amazing teachers, who all go above and beyond for our tamariki.

Students are doing around an hour a day of reading, writing and mathematics, but also being given lots of chances to do art, fitness, te reo Māori, Kapa Haka, as well as exploring the technology curriculum through their playground designs.

As a school, we have started trialing the use of Pr1me Maths books with our students. Children each get a student workbook that they write in for the year. The books are like textbooks, but are designed for students to be able to write in them. This means that teachers don't have to print off worksheets, or spend hours finding follow-up work that supports the learning from the day's lesson. The maths learning is laid out in a logical format and lessons are sequenced to support a student's growing mathematical knowledge and understanding of concepts.

On Tuesday, Frankie, from Trees for Survival visited to check in on our seedlings. Students helped out weeding the seedlings to help make sure that in winter, when we do our planting, our seedlings are as big and strong as possible.

Tomorrow is the Rodney Rural Schools Swimming competition at Rodney College. We have 15 students taking part. They will be joined by students from Tapora, Tauhoa, and Pakiri Schools, as well as several homeschooled students. Last year we did a fantastic job at this event, and I'm sure tomorrow will be just as good. Thanks you again to the parent helpers who are helping out.
